In this first course in our two-part series on emotions, Michelle Garcia Winner, the founder of Social Thinking, will examine how emotions are an ever-present undercurrent that influence so much of what each person does, including the ability to engage in classroom learning, peer-based group work, social problem solving, and relationship building. Emotions also impact life memories (episodic memories) and fuel motivation to tackle goals. Discover why negative emotions tend to take center stage and often become barriers in an individual's personal and academic achievement—and strategies to break the cycle. Throughout the day, participants will engage in hands-on activities and practice using practical treatment\* tools to help clients, students, and patients unpack and manage their emotions, express themselves, understand others' emotions, and strengthen interpersonal social communication. #### Emotions Part 2: More Than We Think and All That We Feel | ages 5 - adult

In this second course in our two-day series on emotions, Michelle Garcia Winner, the founder of Social Thinking explores how an individual's emotions play a large role in relationship development and interpersonal communication. She expands on the concepts introduced in Part 1 and explores how emotional understanding of oneself and the ability to interpret others' emotions are embedded within academic standards and are critical for the development of 21st century work skills. Delve into case studies to explore strategies and ideas to help clients, patients, and students who have experienced school phobia, social anxiety, low motivation for social learning, and/or weak social problem solving. Explore the use of scales to get an individual's perspective and evaluate anticipated risks associated with interpersonal communication. Come learn how to help others, but enjoy learning about yourself as well!


